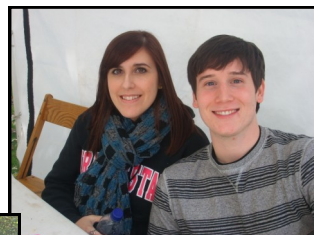




Fall Fest brings cider, chili, pumpkins, hayrides, and face painting
